










Common mistakes 1: Simple future tense with will and be going to

- Wrongly use short form in positive short answers:
 - Will they exchange red packets at Chinese New Year? Yes, they ⁴ → will.
 - Is Debbie going to buy a turkey for this year's Thanksgiving dinner? Yes, she $\frac{1}{3} \rightarrow is$.
- Wrong word order in wh- question:

Which event Susie is \rightarrow is Susie going to join on Sports Day?

Common mistakes 2: Gerunds and to-infinitives

- Forget to use the base form after to-infinitives:

 We managed to made → make a Jack-o'-lantern by ourselves this year.
- Wrongly add **not** after **to** when forming negative **to**-infinitives:

 Howard reminded me **to**-not → not to wear black clothes at Chinese New Year.
- Use to-infinitives instead of gerunds after certain verbs:

 Dad suggests to buy → buying a real Christmas tree this year.
